
To the White House

This is not a 'just popping out to the pub' sort of a walk, it's all uphill from High Peak, the good news is that it's downhill all the way back home again. For those who don't fancy the walk to the White House, there's always the bus to Halifax which stops right outside!



There are a choice of routes to Lygate; either go straight up the lane to the end, turn right and head along Blackstone Edge Road or walking through the fields whereby you\_go up the lane and over the stile on the right hand side. Head down the field alongside the wall and then a track, through a gap in the wall and over the stile next to wooden gate that is in the middle of the wall at the bottom of the field. Turn left and walk alongside the wall, through the gate and across the next field heading towards Lydgate which was formerly an 18<sup>th</sup> century woollen mill (now converted into houses). Go over the stile to the main road and go right up towards the white farmhouse at the side of it.

You now have a choice of routes:

1 Head up the track to High Peak hamlet, carry on in front of the cottages and head towards the moor following the path along the wall side. When you reach a farm track, cross over and head for the track that takes you directly up to the top of the Hill. This is the Roman Road. When you reach the dyke at the top, go left and follow the path. This takes you to the A58, cross the road and go uphill a short way to the White House.

**2** Carry on up the road until you reach the A58. Cross the road and head towards a bridleway track marked by two large stones. This winds its way uphill to reach the A58 and the White House. Copywrite Jean Molyneux 2010 Not to be reproduced without the authors permission.
